Want to Communicate? Go Ahead. <sup>SM</sup>



Relay Texas is a free service that provides full telephone accessibility to people who are deaf, hard-of-hearing, deaf-blind, and speech disabled. This service allows text-telephone (TTY) users to communicate with regular telephone users through specially trained relay agents.

Calls can be made to anywhere in the world, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year with no restrictions on the number, length, or type of calls. All calls are strictly confidential and no records of any conversations are maintained.

Anyone wishing to use Relay Texas simply dials the relay number to connect with an agent. The agent will dial the requested number and relay the conversation between the two callers. To make the conversation as natural as possible, agents will type background noises and indicate voice inflections to the TTY user.
