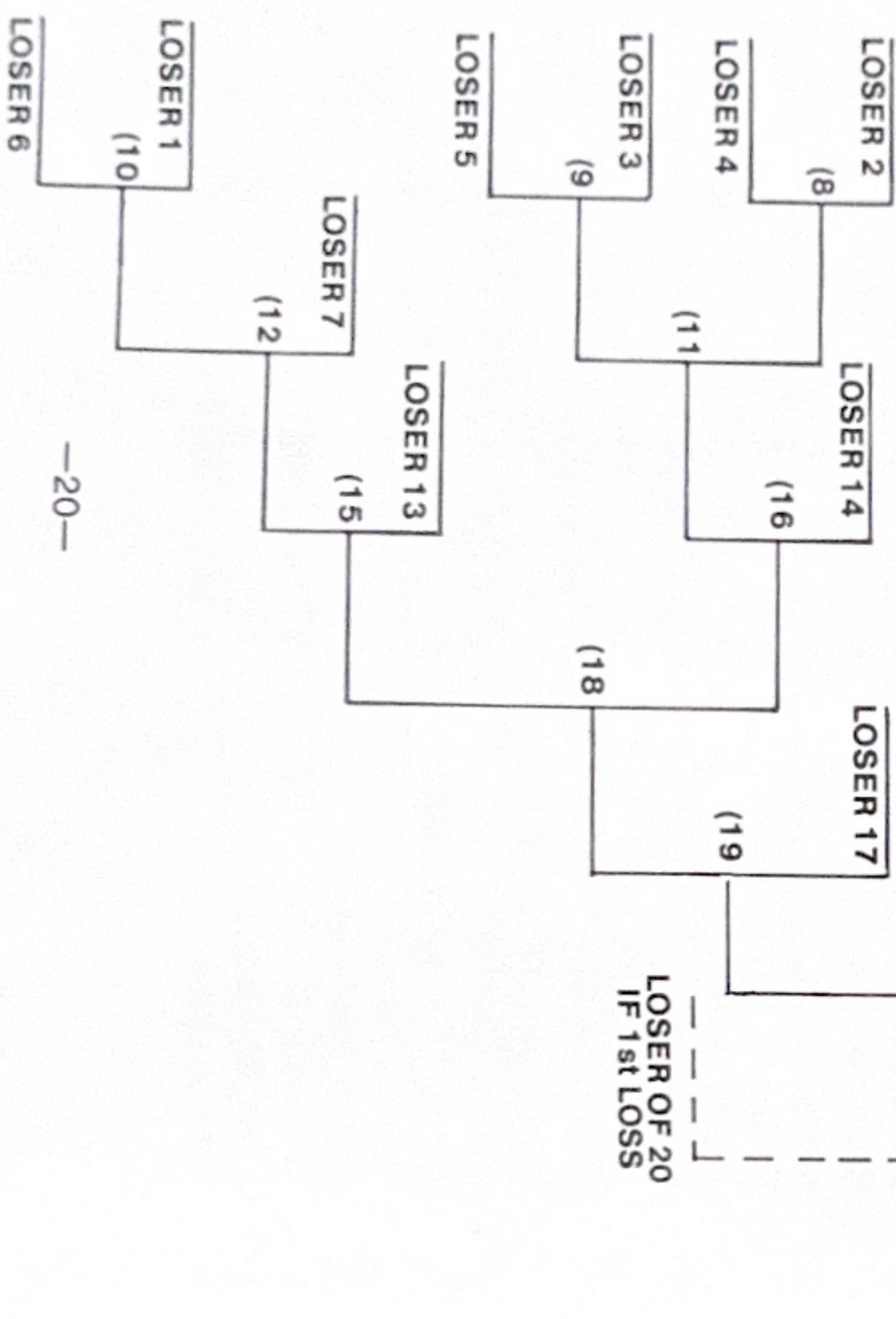

Winners' Bracket



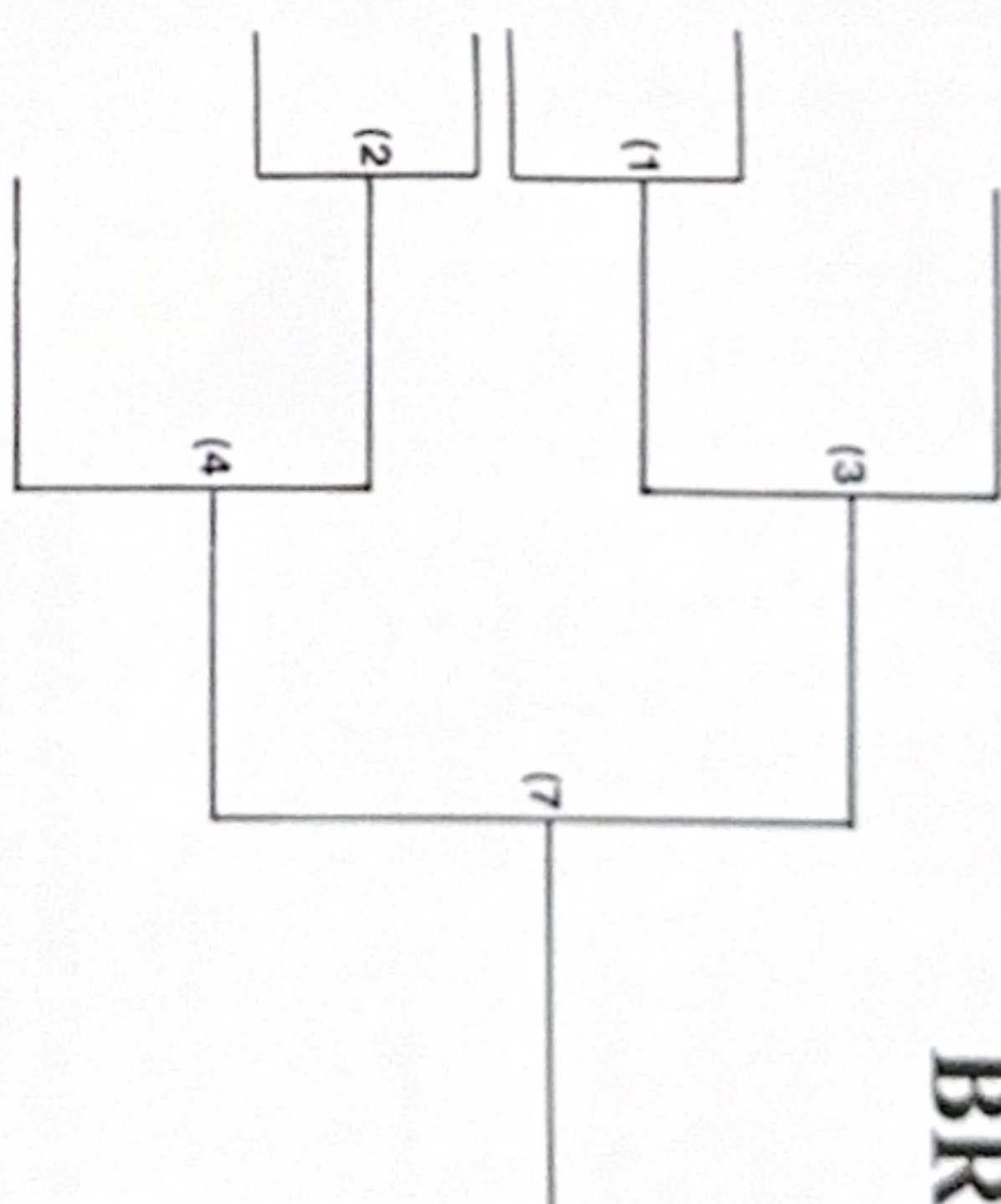
MEN'S BRACKET

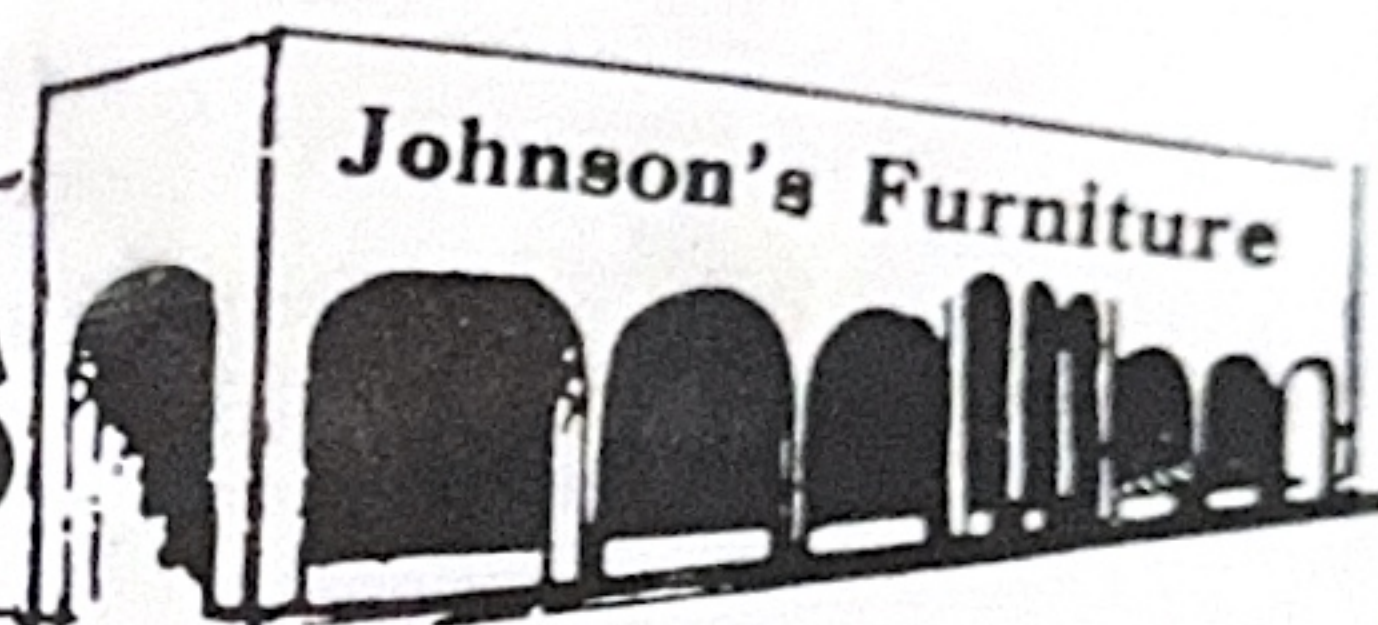
