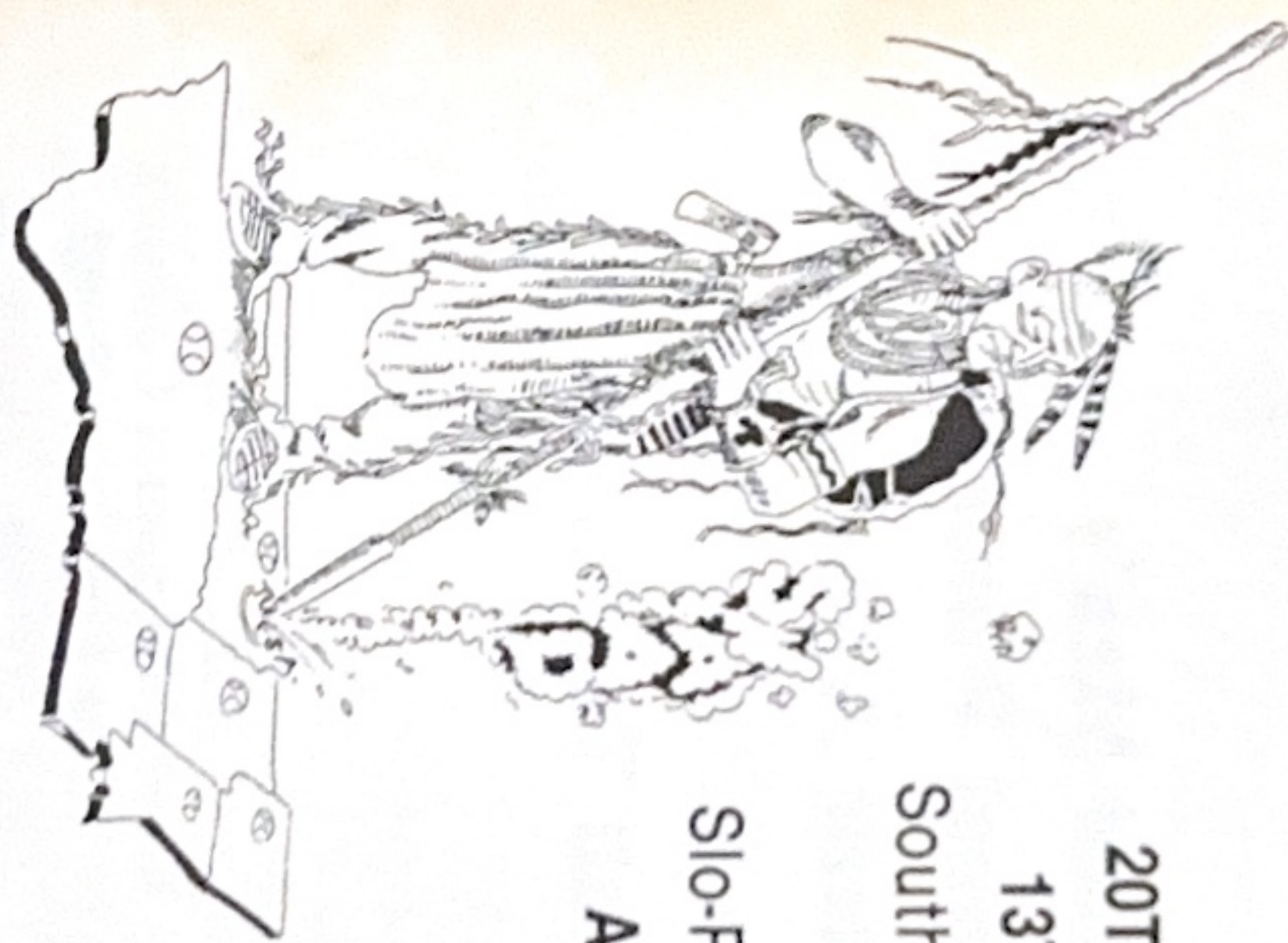

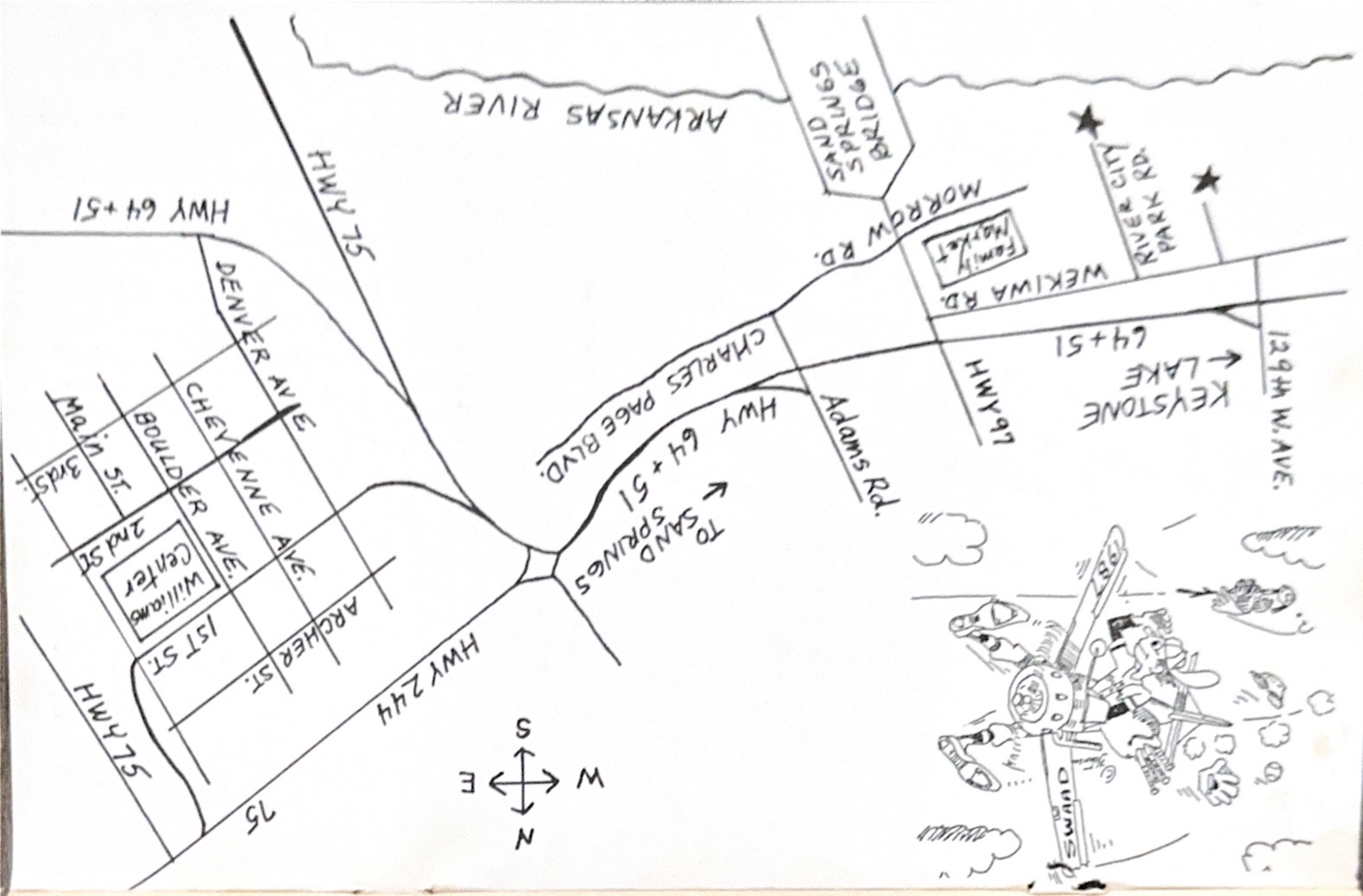

### SWAAD President's Message

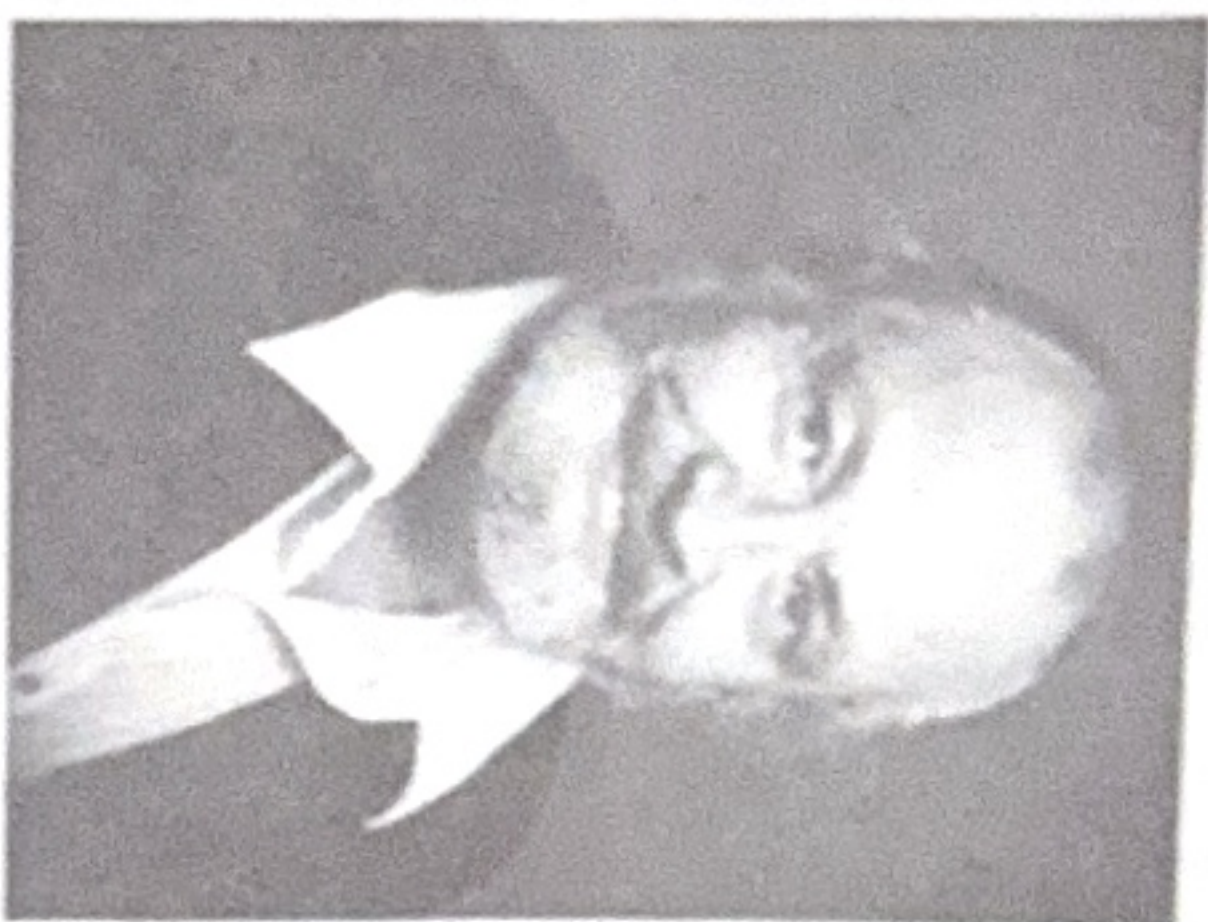

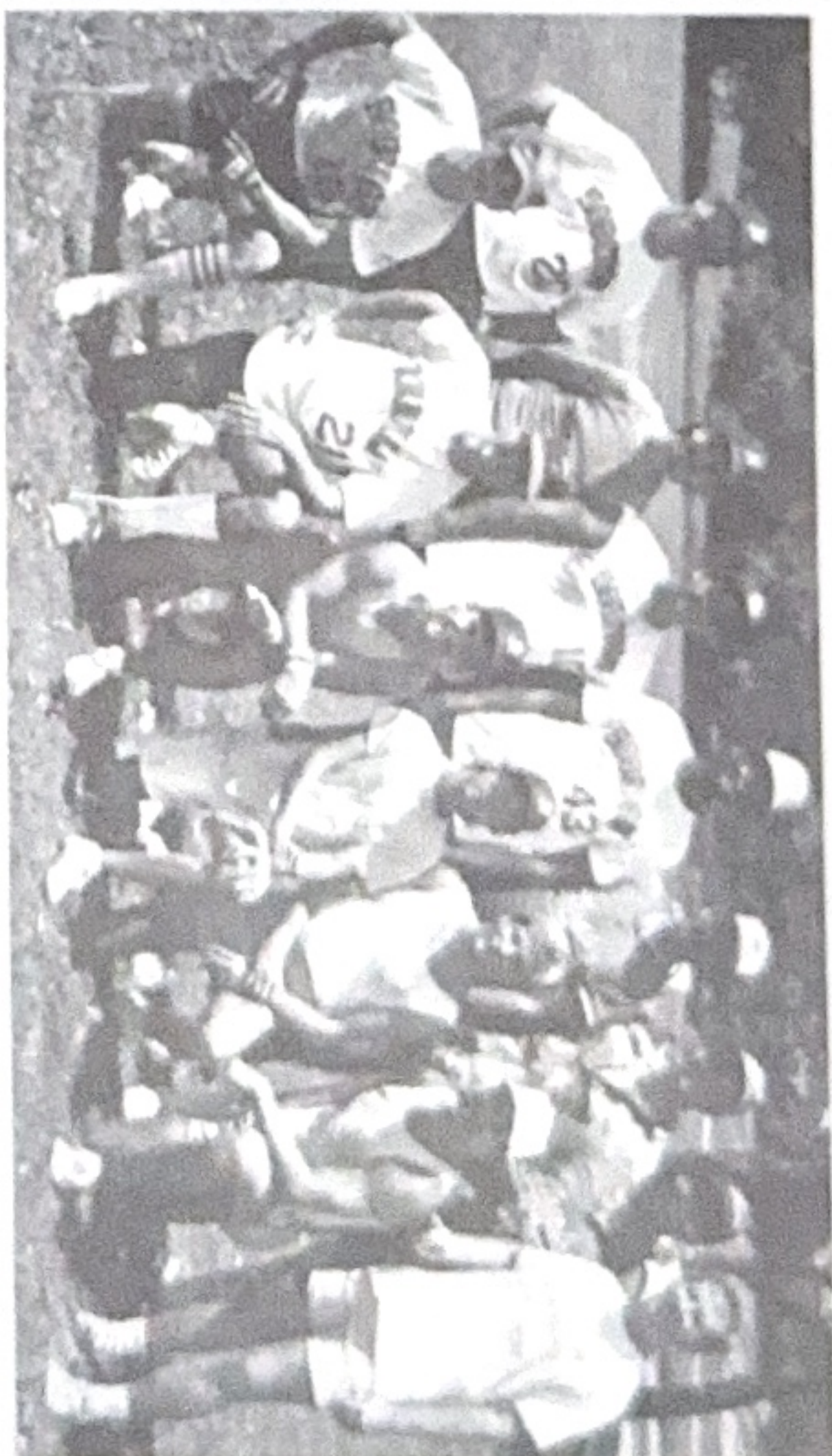
